## ADOPT A GARDEN PLOT

There are 17 plots to adopt on a first come first serve basis. Approximate plot sizes: $10^{\prime}$ by $18^{\prime}$. Adoptable plots require a $\$ 30$ fee that goes towards the water bill for the garden. A signed contract is also required before a plot can be assigned.
